Terrific Two-Sided Photo Puzzle

Violet took a lot of photos when she was in Alaska. One of her favorite photos was of the icebergs. Another was of Benny panning for gold. She had wanted to make her most special photo into a jigsaw puzzle. But she couldn't choose between the two. So she decided to make a two-sided puzzle. Here's how she did it.

You will need: Two photographs that are the same size, thin cardboard, scissors, white glue, and pencils.

Here's what you do:

1. Trim the cardboard so that it is the same size as the photographs.
2. Glue one photo to the front of the cardboard and one photo to the back of the cardboard.
3. Use the pencil to lightly draw the shapes of puzzle pieces onto one of the pictures.
4. Cut the puzzle apart on the pencil lines.
5. Now put the puzzle together. Remember that each puzzle piece can be used for both sides.
